Tenterfield Shire Indigenous Culture

Tenterfield Shire is rich in Aboriginal history and includes the traditional tribes and nations of Ngarabal, Jukembal, Bundjalung, Kamilaroi, Githabul, and Wahlbul.

The Moombahlene Local Aboriginal Land Council (MLALC) plays a role in the development and support of indigenous people in Tenterfield Shire, the Gunimaa Native Nursery is on Railway Ave and Armajun Health Services also supports the local community.

Some areas of interest include Curry's Gap Natures' Reserve, Bluff Rock, Bald Rock and Boonoo Boonoo State Forest.

National Parks

Explore Bald Rock, Australia's largest granite monolith; Boonoo Boonoo, known for its excellent swimming holes; Basket Swamp, featuring horizon pools & waterfalls; Koreelah, offering Gondwana rainforest hikes; Torrington, with dramatic views and rock formations. The Border Trail

The Border Trail is a self-guided, multi-use series of trails located around Legume, Liston, Cullendore, Wylie Creek and Undercliffe. Incredible walking, biking, running trails plus camping in rainforests and on farming land

Facilities include a mountain bike skills park, skatepark, playground, pump track and basketball courts plus picnic area Cnr Crown and Manners St

Park Run

Every Saturday from 8am at Jubilee Park on Manners St, a free fun weekly 5km walk, jog or run or come and watch or volunteer Jubilee Parkrun Tenterfield

DRIVE

Mt Mackenzie Scenic Lookout

Great photo opportunities at the top of town, 1,300m above sea level, exceptional views and only a 13km drive or ride from the Tenterfield CBD

Kildare Road Loop

38km drive that takes 30min in the picturesque surrounds of the mountains, farmland, rock formations and multi-coloured woodlands on the Mount Mackenzie Scenic Drive (Tourist Drive 9)

Thunderbolt Hideout

This historic site is a tribute to the notorious outlaw Fred Ward, better known as Captain Thunderbolt, who was the longest roaming bushranger in Australia's history. Located 5min drive from the CBD on the Mt Lindesay Rd

LOCAL GEMS

Tenterfield Saddler

Made famous by Peter Allen's song the Tenterfield Saddler, is a quaint blue-granite saddlery on High Street. This property is also National Trust listed Wed to Sun 9am to 12.30pm | 123 High St

Tenterfield Railway Museum

Free entry to all schools, pets are welcome, plenty of parking for large vehicles and vans. Open 9am to 4pm Except Mon & Tues | 21 Railway Ave

Tenterfield Cork Tree

Started life in a jam jar in 1861 in England. This old cork tree has seen lots in its time and you can see it at Wood St between Molesworth & Martin St Tenterfield

Centenary Cottage Museum

The Centenary Cottage Museum contains a collection of buildings and memorabilia from years ago. Open Sat-Mon 10-3 (dependent on availability of volunteers). 136 Logan St centenarycottageuseum.com.au

Sir Henry Parkes Memorial School of Arts

National Trust and heritage listed building, former 'School of Arts' & now museum, theatre, cinema, library and community centre. A must to visit..

WALK

Tenterfield was gazetted as a town in 1851. 1889 Sir Henry Parkes delivered a speech in Tenterfield in the historic School of Arts building in favour of Federation that increased momentum towards the Australian commonwealth and federation of all Australian states. Download the 'Soundtrails' App via the App Store to be guided by a historic walk through Tenterfield. Some key landmarks on this walk are as follows;

Post Office -1878 - 1881 Cnr Manners & Rouse St

The building was completed by T.A. Lewis, ft. Italianate façade and a clock tower with a mansard roof.

St Stephen's Presbyterian Church - 1884 117 Logan St

The wedding of renowned poet A.B. "Banjo" Paterson and Miss Alice Walker of Tenterfield Station occurred in this church in 1903.

Royal Hotel - 1849 130 High St

Originally the George Inn, holder of Tenterfield's first liquor licence granted in 1849. The hotel was recently refurbished

Tenterfield Star Building - 1870 325 Rouse St

The Star was first published in 1870. This building was built in 1914 for J.F. Thomas, editor, and solicitor for 'Breaker' Morant's Boer War trial.

Police Station & Gaol - 1870 94 Molesworth St

Tenders were called in 1862 for the building of a Police Station. The Court House was completed by the McGauran Bros. in 1885. After a tragic fire of a police house in 1926, police moved to the Court House. The station headquarters remained there for the next 50 years.

Court House - 1870 94 Molesworth St

Built by the McGauran Bros and listed with the National Trust

Commercial Boutique Hotel - 1856 282 Rouse St

Known as the Tenterfield Hotel in 1856. Burnt to the ground in 1857, it was replaced with a large stone three-story building and became known as the Commercial Hotel. The present building built in 1941 is an excellent example of the art deco construction.

Sculpture Walk

The Sculpture Walk starts from the top of the Youth Precinct on Miles Street, continues along Tenterfield Creek and finishes at the 'The Speaking Poles' in Millbrook Park on Naas St.



GARDENS

Tenterfield is renowned for its spectacular high country gardens during the months of Autumn and Spring. You can also visit gardens during the New England Garden Festival www.negf.com.au

4. Naas St | Millbrook Park
5. Miles St | eastern side of town
6. Poplar trees near Bluff Rock on the New England Highway | south of town
7. Douglas St | western side of Rouse St
8. Mt Lindesay Rd - On the way to Bald Rock and Boonoo Boonoo National Park - north of town
9. Clarence St/Bruxner Highway

DISCOVER

Tenterfield Shire is one of the largest shires in NSW and has seven unique villages

DRAKE

Located 44km east of the CBD. Known for camping, offroad motorcycling and Paddys Flat Tank Traps. The Lunatic Hotel is a great stop for lunch or a cold beverage

JENNINGS

Jennings is located on the NSW/QLD border. Home to a famous Victorian-era railway station built exactly on the state border. Only 10km to the well-known Girraween National Parks and vineyards

LEGUME

Legume is a small village with plenty of charm and natural wonders and is located on the northeast corner of Tenterfield near Killarney. Koreelah National Park is located here and has great camping areas

LISTON

Small rural village with lush countryside and close to many of Tenterfield's national parks. Aloomba Lavender Farm and Cullendore High Country Camping grounds are located here along with the Cobb & Co Museum plus the historic cemetery at Willsons Downfall

MINGOOLA

Mingoola was once a major tobacco growing area and is located 57km west of Tenterfield. Sundown National Park is 12km away and there are also some great outdoor activities like hiking, motorbike, camping, fishing & mountain bike riding

TORRINGTON

Located 68km southwest of the CBD, Torrington has 30,000 hectares of untamed walking trails, rock formations including the famous Mystery Face and was famous for its tin mines and fossicking

URBENVILLE

The northern gateway to the Tenterfield Shire is known for its lush rainforests, rivers, flora, fauna and national parks including Tooloom Falls. Great walking, fishing, 4wd driving and bird watching plus check out the Crown Hotel
